

### Math Corrections

Students with a homework grade on a completed assignment of 69% or lower, have the option to correct it. The highest score students will receive on the corrected assignment is an 80%. When correcting, students must only do the problems that they missed and staple their corrections to the top of the original assignment. All corrections will be due on the day that they are tested over the material.
